Ludwig Denig (1755-1830) was a shoemaker and apothecary living in colonial and revolutionary Pennsylvania. He drew on Pennsylvania and on the devotional and biblical spirituality of regional Lutheran and Dutch Reformed churches to create a leather-bound manuscript that combines a number of theological and artistic traditions. The volume he created provides a unique document of one man's religious and cultural life, illustrated with images informed by the world around him. This manuscript combines a number of devotional, theological, and artistic traditions, but that combination created a manuscript and work of art that is unique to early America. The watercolors he created reflect details drawn from firsthand experience, colonial print culture, and the objects that surrounded him in daily life and work.

The Denig Manuscript Project is a collaboration between the Winterthur Museum, Garden and Library and the Roy Rosenzweig Center for History and New Media. The project received support from The Paper Project at the Getty Museum, the Schwartz Foundation, and Winterthur Museum, Garden & Library.

UNIVERSITY COURSES TAUGHT

History Behind the Scenes (HIST/MSST 385), University of Delaware: Summer 2018.

On its surface, *History Behind the Scenes: Exploring Delaware's Libraries, Museums, and Historic Sites* engages student interest with exciting, behind-the-scenes access to the area's cultural heritage institutions. Yet the course was conceived primarily to use inquiry-based learning to teach students the basics of examining primary sources and thinking critically about collective memory. Designed to attract enrollment from non-majors, the class explores issues in nonprofit administration, visits 10 libraries and museums, and completes an advocacy assignment in which students contact elected officials about the importance of heritage preservation to civic life. The course fulfills an undergraduate "Discovery Learning Experience" requirement at the University of Delaware.

Exploring the Country House Library: Books, Architecture, Interior Design, and Estate Life at Nemours, Wilmington, DE: Rosenbach Museum & Library and Nemours Estate: October 10, 2026.

When you hear the term "country house library," you may immediately think of the great country house collections of the United Kingdom. But did you know that historic country houses in the Mid-Atlantic region are home to remarkable

rare book collections to this very day? In this special, behind-the-scenes excursion, join the Rosenbach and Nemours Estate for an in-depth look at books and other objects connected to the du Pont dynasty of Delaware. You will learn about the history of this fascinating estate, the legacy of book collecting among the du Ponts, and the importance of country house library collections to our understanding of the history of reading. The day's events will occur in behind-the-scenes spaces around the Nemours Estate, with up-close access to collections. The course includes a private bus tour, fascinating historical lectures, and behind-the-scenes visit to the du Ponts' manuscript and library collections. You will receive two complimentary tickets to return to the estate for a formal house tour at a later date. Join us for an unforgettable journey into our region's history and culture.

Portrait of a Citizen: 250 Years of Stephen Girard in Philadelphia, Rosenbach Museum & Library: June 6, 2026.

On June 6, 1776, a young, ambitious French mariner and merchant named Stephen Girard sailed into Philadelphia, and into the eye of the revolutionary storm remaking America and the world, as Great Britain's thirteen North American colonies sought their independence. Though he did not know it at the time, Girard's fate became closely intertwined with that of the city, where he resided for the rest of his life. Girard earned acclaim during his lifetime and shortly after his death for his civic volunteerism and philanthropy, though over the generations, his reputation has suffered due to debate surrounding his attitudes on race, gender, and enslavement. The Rosenbach owns a portrait of Girard painted shortly after his death by notable local artist Bass Otis, which invites consideration of Girard's evolving legacy over the centuries.

On the 250th anniversary of Girard's arrival in Philadelphia, join the Rosenbach for an afternoon seminar focused on the Bass Otis portrait and the story of Girard's decision to cast his lot with the young American republic. In this session, we will study the Otis portrait as well as rare books and manuscripts connected to Girard in the Rosenbach collection before tracing Girard's self-fashioning as the ideal citizen of the early American republic. As the Rosenbach looks forward to the national semiquincentennial in July, the course will conclude with shared reflections on lessons we can draw from Girard's life, philanthropy, and approach to engaged citizenship.

The Curator's Toolkit: Up Close and Personal with the Collections of the Rosenbach, Stoneleigh, and du Pont Estates in the Brandywine River Valley, Rosenbach Museum & Library: Winter & Spring 2026.

Do you love discovering fascinating stories from history? Have you ever wanted to get up close and personal with museum and library collection objects, including rare books, manuscripts, paintings, and decorative arts? If so, then this course is for you.

The Curator's Toolkit will equip you with knowledge and skills for handling, studying, preserving, and learning from fine art, antiques, rare books, and manuscripts at the Rosenbach Museum & Library and beyond, granting you behind-the-scenes access to world-renowned museum and library collections. You will even study the exhibition design process, research manuscripts in the Rosenbach collection, and write an exhibition object label. In this course, the Rosenbach becomes your laboratory for the study and enjoyment of rare books, manuscripts, art, and artifacts.

This year's offering of The Curator's Toolkit includes a focus on how historic homes and estates—as well as their collections of books and art—transform into public museums, libraries, and gardens. The course features three optional weekend field trips to some of the region's most beloved cultural sites (Winterthur, Longwood, Hagley, and Stoneleigh) to take behind-the-scenes tours and talk with staff about collection care, management, and interpretation.

This course is intended as a foundational introduction to museums, libraries, and the study of historic artifacts. No background knowledge is assumed or required. All who are curious about the world of books, manuscripts, libraries, and museums are welcome!

Stephen Girard: Finding a Forgotten Founding Father, Rosenbach Museum & Library: Fall 2024.

Join the Rosenbach for an epic voyage into Philadelphia's Revolutionary and early national history! Stephen Girard, a French émigré who took up residence in Revolutionary Philadelphia and became the wealthiest man in the early United States, is mostly remembered today as the philanthropic founder of Girard College—and for Civil Rights litigation surrounding the school in the 1960s. Hailed as a leading civic hero shortly after his death, today Girard has receded into the background of Philadelphia's collective memory. In this two-session course, travel behind the scenes into the

collections of Girard College and the Rosenbach to study rare books, manuscripts, and artworks, and become acquainted with this complex, forgotten Founding Father. (Co-taught with Kathy Haas and Brenna Holland.)

The Curator’s Toolkit: Up Close and Personal with the Rosenbach’s Collection, Rosenbach Museum & Library: Fall 2021 and 2022.

Do you love discovering fascinating stories from history? Have you ever wanted to get up close and personal with museum and library collection objects, including rare books, manuscripts, paintings, furniture, precious metals, and ceramics? If so, then this course is for you.

The Curator’s Toolkit will equip you with knowledge and skills for handling, studying, preserving, and learning from fine art, antiques, rare books, and manuscripts at The Rosenbach and beyond, and give you hands-on, behind-the-scenes access to a world-renowned museum and library collection. You will even have the opportunity to study the museum exhibition design process and research objects in the collection. In this course, the historic Rosenbach house becomes your laboratory for the study and enjoyment of art, artifacts, and historic texts.

Each Curator’s Toolkit course session will combine lectures and discussions with hands-on Artifact Labs that put real Rosenbach collection objects in students’ hands, in order to apply lessons from the course readings and learn directly from original materials. The course is intended as a foundational introduction to museums, libraries, and the study of historic artifacts, and no background knowledge is assumed. (Co-taught with the Rosenbach Collections Department.)
