How to use Minnesota Reflections

Minnesota Reflections provides access to more than 58,000 images and documents relating to Minnesota history and more. More than 115 of the state's libraries, museums, and other cultural institutions have contributed to Minnesota Reflections, making it a great place to look for primary sources relating to your History Day project.



- Conduct a general search from the Minnesota Reflections homepage.
- Browse by collection or region to focus on a particular geographic area.
- Use the Advanced Search feature to search specific collections and precisely define your search terms.

Once you have located a specific item of interest, Minnesota Reflections makes it easy for you to save, cite, and return to the object.

- Add the item to your "My Favorites" folder by clicking the "add to favorites" button. (This feature only saves favorites to the specific computer station where favorites are made.)
- Click "Cite the item" to get a short web address back to the object—perfect for works cited documents.
- Click the "Clip image" button (which looks like an X-acto knife) to crop and save a version of the image to your hard drive.


